<p style="text-align: center;">Symmetrical Arrangement</p> <p>One symmetrical design will be performed using the materials provided. This is an arrangement designed to be decorative at the ceremony, usually located against a wall or on an altar.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Mechanics must be secure and covered. ● Students may solve this challenge in a variety of ways, however, basic principles and elements of design must be evident 	<p><i>70 min./5 min. clean up</i></p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Center Piece Including Candles</p> <p>Centre piece suitable for a round table which seats eight people. This design must include candles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Mechanics must be secured and covered ● Students may solve this challenge in a variety of ways, however, basic principles and elements of design must be evident 	<p><i>45 min./5 min. clean up</i></p>

<p style="text-align: center;">Vase Arrangement</p> <p>A vase arrangement suitable for the guest book at the reception. The table is oval and is 6 feet long and 4 feet wide, and only the guest book and the arrangement will be on the table. The table is located in the centre of a large foyer, welcoming the guests as they arrive.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Mechanics must be secured and covered ● Students may solve this challenge in a variety of ways, however, basic principles and elements of design must be evident 	<p><i>50 min/5 min. clean up</i></p>
<p>Set up display/Presentation</p> <p>Describe the rationale for the floral design and knowledge of design display. Students will describe their designs, identifying feature flowers and foliage, design styles, colour schemes, and suitability of design to overall theme. This description should be reflective of the language they would use to describe the designs to a customer.</p>	<p><i>15 min/5 min. clean up</i></p>
