**SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:**

- Theoretical knowledge of carpentry and general practices.
- Blueprint reading and interpretation.
- Design and layout of building materials
- Construction/Assembly of a project
- Safe operation of hand and power tools.

## **SAFETY REQUIREMENTS:**

Competitors are required to follow all "Industry Safety Standards" during the competition.

- It is mandatory for all competitors to wear CSA approved **EYEWEAR**.
- It is mandatory for all competitors to wear CSA approved **FOOTWEAR**.
- Jewelry such as rings, bracelets, and necklaces or any item deemed unsafe by the competition judges must be removed.
- Proper shop attire must be worn (NO LOOSE CLOTHING)

- Adjustable Clamps (Bar/C-Clamp)
- Carpenter's Hammer(s)
- Framing Square
- Speed Square(s)
- Combination Square
- Level(s)
- Chalk Line
- Workbench/Table/Work Horses
- BROOM, DUST PANS & GARBAGE CONTAINER

### **CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS:**

- Competitors are to be dressed in a clean appropriate manner.
- Competitors are to wear DSBN technology shirts.
- Competitors are not permitted to wear clothing with any other logo than the DSBN.
- Safety Glasses Required.
- CSA Approved safety footwear required.
- Any added PPE as per safety policies.

### **PROJECT AND COMPETITION EXPECTATIONS:**

### **JUDGING CRITERIA:**

- Judging will be conducted by specialists in Carpentry and Niagara College representatives for the competition.
- The trade skill component of this challenge is worth approximately **75%** of the overall mark. The judges will also evaluate the competitor's working knowledge of construction safety, level of independence, and clean-up. Competitors will receive the blue prints and the evaluation 2 days prior to the day of the challenge. At the provincial level, students will be expected to be prepared with a resume and must complete a job interview component.

### **JOB INTERVIEW COMPONENT:**

- All students should be prepared with a resume, an interview workshop will be held for gold medalists moving on to provincial competitions.

**ENTRY:** Students must register online at <http://teched.dsbm.org/skills> with all of the required information completed to be eligible to participate.

**TRANSPORTATION:**

- Teachers and students are responsible for their own transportation to and from St. Catharines Market Square the day of the Carpentry Challenge.

**TEACHER'S ROLE:**

- Instructors are expected to acquaint their student participants with all of the enclosed guidelines. Teachers may accompany their students or visit any time during the competition, but may not assist the competitors during the challenge.
