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PURPOSE OF THE CONTEST:

Students from D.S.B.N. will compete and demonstrate their knowledge and skill in carpentry and be recognized for their excellence and professionalism in the field of construction technology.

EVENT DETAILS:

Date: February 12, 2014
Time: Competitors arrive at 8:30 am
Location: Market Square, St. Catharines

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

- Demonstrate skills and competency in reading instructions and project drawings
- Safety, including proper dress requirements
- Quality, accuracy and thoroughness of workmanship
- Ability to complete project independently and in a specific time period
- Proper use of tools
- General work attitude

CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS:

All competitors must wear their own hard hat, safety footwear, safety glasses at all times during the practical competition. Hearing protection is optional.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS:

Competitors are required to follow all industry safety standards during the competition.

EQUIPMENT, MATERIALS, TOOLS AND SUPPLIES:

Equipment Supplied by the Contest Coordinator:

All building materials, nails and fasteners will be provided.

- All equipment should be properly maintained in good working order and stored in a tool box.

JOB INTERVIEW COMPONENT:

To assist competitors in fully preparing for their eventual job searches, it is expected that they arrive prepared WITH A RÉSUMÉ. An interview workshop will replace the job interview for gold medalists moving on to provincial competitions.

ENTRY:

Students register online at: TechEd.dsbn.org/skills with all of the required information completed to be eligible to participate. Teachers should also forward a list of competitors participating from their school to the contest coordinator 7days prior to the date of the contest.

TRANSPORTATION:

Students are responsible for their own transportation.

TEACHER'S ROLE:

Instructors are expected to acquaint their student participants with all of the enclosed guidelines. Teachers may accompany their students or visit any time during the competition, but may not assist the competitors during the challenge.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS OR GUIDELINES:

1. Competitors are responsible for the clean-up of their work area and removal of their project. The project is about 4'-0" x 4'-6" x 5'-6" high.
2. Work area is covered, but dress for the cold.
3. Lunch will be provided.
